## WORKSHEET II

### 1. The story so far

The year is 2008. Jamie is writing a book for teachers. It's a book of ideas for the classroom and he wants to include the following puzzle:

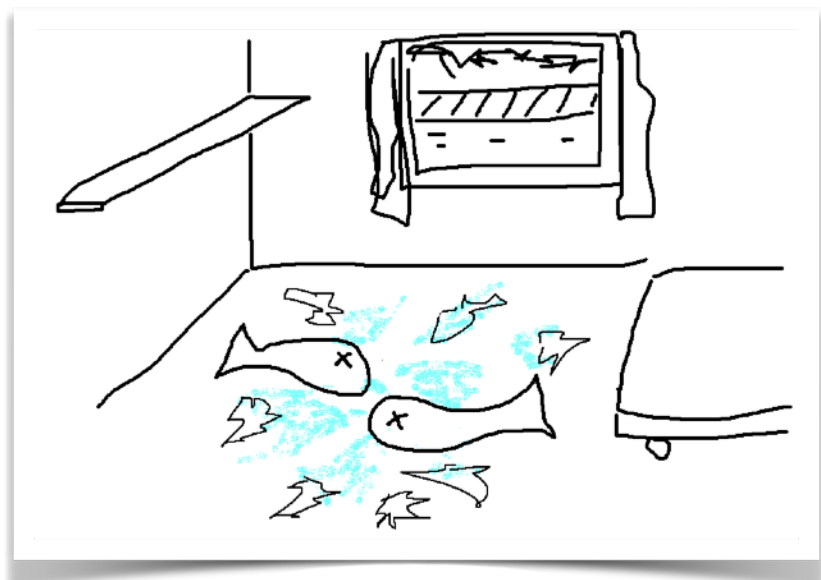
Romeo and Juliet are dead.

### 3. Put yourself in Jamie's situation

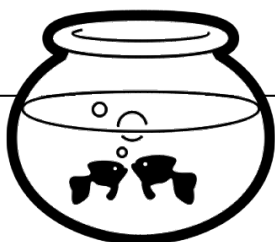
Write an email to Nicolás. Thank him for his reply and then give him clear instructions for the illustration that he is going to create.
